COWBOY MOUNTED SHOOTING



Cowboy mounted shooting is a timed event in which competitors use two single action revolvers, loaded with special blanks, to shoot at 10 ballon targets while navigating a selected course. Seasoned shooters and horses can also compete in rifle and shotgun courses using CMSA approved lever, pump, revolving action rifle or double barrel shotgun.

COMMON QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

How to get started?

Sign yourself and your horse up for one of organized clinics, where you will learn about gun safety and handling. You will also learn how to navigate a selected course from your own two feet. While you are practicing from the ground, your horse will becoming accustomed to the gunfire. Later in the clinic, you will be able to shoot from your horse!

Are there breed or tack restrictions?

Any breed of horse, mule or pony in good health condition can compete. Your equine friend MUST be able to neck rein with one hand because you will have to be able to safely handle a gun in the other hand. Competitors need western style saddles and properly fitted tack. Most bits and hackamores are accepted.

Is there a dress code?

Yes, there is a dress code with some restrictions. A western style hat or protective helmet is required when competing. Along with long sleeved western style shirt. Modern western style jeans with chaps or chinks. Western style cowboy or cowgirl boots with heel. Female competitors have an option to wear a skirt or dress of the nineteenth century style.

The CMSA has different classes and different levels. Levels are gender split for mens and ladies. There are six levels within mens, ladies, senior mens and senior ladies. Seniors must be at least 50 years of age. Wranglers are competitors 11 or under.

All new members start out as level one and compete with only level one members.

Competitors will move up to the next level once completing the qualifying number of wins within their current level.

Your score is based off the time it takes you and your horse to complete the selected course. There are some penalties that can affect your completed time.
